IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO ENTER YOUR DOGS FOR THE ALL BREED SHOWS IF YOU WISH TO ONLY ENTER FOR THE OBEDIENCE TRIALS. THE ENTRY FEES FOR OBEDIENCE IS - **Rs.600/-** per class inclusive of catalogue.

The Madras Canine Club will acknowledge receipt of the entry, but nevertheless, it shall also be the duty of the exhibitor to also ascertain that their entries have reached "The Madras Canine Club".

**NB: Entry sent by Whatsapp & email will not be accepted under any circumstances. Entry forms received without entry fees will also not accepted under any circumstances.** All entry forms should necessarily be accompanied by a xerox copy of the KCI Registration certificate including the reverse side where the transfer of ownership is effected.

**AWARDS: At the Madras Canine Club's triple Ch. Dog Shows only Challenge Certificates will be awarded and attractive Trophies and prizes befitting the occasion will be awarded to winners.**

**ELIGIBILITY:** CRYPTORCHID AND MONORCHID DOGS will not be allowed to compete in the breed class and bitches in season will not be allowed to compete for Obedience.

The Show Committee reserves the right to nominate a new / alternative judge in the event of any of the above mentioned judges not being able to fulfil their obligation and should there be more entries than expected in any group the Show Committee reserves the right to allot a breed or breeds to any other judge in the panel or nominate a new judge in order to finish the show on time. The Show Committee reserves the right to change the order of judging if required and hence exhibitors should bench their dogs on time.

Dogs would be judged simultaneously in all the rings and the order of judging would be notified later. Exhibitors are hence requested to have sufficient number of handlers should they have more than one breed and also bench their dogs close to the rings where they are being judged.

Exhibitors are requested to note that exhibit numbers will not be called over the public address system and hence they will have to follow the show catalogue and programme sheet and be present in the ring on their own. The Club shall not be held responsible if exhibitors are not present in the ring when their class is being judged. Exhibitors are requested to dress themselves suitably. It is advised that exhibitors must wear shoes when they are handling their dogs.

**CAUTION:** Exhibitors should make themselves familiar with the KCI Rules and Regulations for Shows, copies of which may be obtained from the KCI on payment of Rs.50/-. Exhibitors are cautioned that an entry in the wrong Class or Breed will disqualify the exhibit automatically.

**CHALLENGE CERTIFICATE:** Challenge and Reserve Challenge Certificates will be awarded at the Show (CCs & Res.CCs). All Indian Breeds are eligible for CCs. As per KCI rules Reserve CCs will not be taken into consideration for computing Championship status.

**PENALTY:** Any wilful misrepresentations regarding ownership, age, name, pedigree, etc. of dogs entered and/or prepared for exhibition in contravention of the KCI Regulations, will be liable for disciplinary action by the Committee.

**Note:** Dogs that are not present in the ring when their classes are judged will be deemed to have been absent.

**OBJECTIONS:** Objections will be decided by the Madras Canine Club Committee in accordance with the KCI Regulations. The objection fee is Rs.2000/- returnable if the objection is upheld by the Show Committee and forfeited if the objection is rejected.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE:** As per new KCI Rules All dogs who have obtained 4 CCs under 4 different Judges are entitled to be called Champions provided the dog

has obtained the 4th CC after the age of 12 month and irrespective of whether a 'Champion' certificate has been issued to the dog or not.

As per the rule a dog with 3 CCs entered at a twin Show can become a 'champion' in Ring 1, as soon as the 4th CC is awarded at the first of the two shows. Contrary to the earlier rule which has now been amended, a dog that has obtained the 4th CC at the first of the two shows organized on the same day, the exhibit should be continued to be shown in the same class it has been entered prior to it becoming a Champion. Nevertheless if the dog has been entered at a subsequent shows at a later date, it is compulsory that the dog should be entered in the Champion Class only even though the dog may have been entered in any other class.

Exhibitors may note that all puppies would have to be entered only in the Puppy class as per the KCI Rules.

Further please note that all exhibits eligible to compete for the Best in Show line up shall only be such exhibit that have won a BOB / RBOB as a Champion or won a CC with BOB or RBOB. A non-champion winning the Best of Breed without a Challenge Certificate is not eligible to participate in the group judging or Best in Show line up. As per the KCI directive the 11 Group system will be followed and the rule of picking 21 dogs in the line up will be followed. Indian breeds have been classified as a separate group and classified as Group-11.

It has been decided to classify Indian Breeds as a separate group and will henceforth be classified as Group Eleven - Indigenous breeds. The first two dogs chosen in this group will be sent for the BIS line up. Contrary to the earlier norm of having 19 dogs in the line up, 21 dogs would be chosen for the line up of which as usual only 8 dogs would get placed.

Exhibitors are prohibited from wearing T-shirts or shirts bearing the name or logo of their Kennel. Those contravening this rule will not be permitted to enter the ring. Exhibitors are requested to read the definition of classes and enter their exhibits in the correct class.

**Important Notice:**

Exhibitors may note that the dog show is being held outdoors and the Madras Canine Club (MCC) will not be responsible for vagaries of the weather, such as rain or excessive heat. Should the show get stopped owing to reasons beyond their control such as excessive rain or heat or other unforeseen circumstances such as public strike, vandalism, etc., the Madras Canine Club will not hold itself responsible and will not refund the entry fee to any exhibitor or for any financial damages or otherwise the exhibitor may have suffered in the process.



**Exhibitors / handlers are hereby warned that any one found drinking or drunk inside the show ground or while handling the exhibit in the show ring will be reported to the KCI. Such persons are liable to be suspended for a minimum period of two years and shall also be fined Rs.1000/-**

**Exhibitors to Note:** Exhibitors to ensure that the microchip that has been passed on to them along with the registration certificates is properly implanted into the dog.  
**Dogs without microchip will not be permitted at the show.**

**As per the recent KCI directive DOUBLE HANDLING is strictly prohibited.** Such of those who resort to double handling inspite of this will automatically entitle the removal of the particular exhibit from the show ring.

**ENFORCEMENT & AMENDMENT OF RULES:** The decision of the Show Committee is final subject only to appeal to KCI. Should questions arise which are not provided for in the rules the Committee's decisions will be final and binding. Any breach of the Rules and/or KCI Regulations will render the exhibitor liable to disciplinary action by the Committee. Exhibitors are also liable for any damage done by them or their servants or their dogs. The Committee, reserves the right to refuse or accept any entry without assigning any reason whatsoever.

**VET-EXAMINATION: All dogs must be checked and passed by the Honorary Veterinary Surgeon, present at the gate and be certified fit by him before admission. The Veterinary certificate should be produced at the Waiting ring to the Waiting Ring Stewards.**

**C-1 PRE BEGINNERS:** 1. Heel on Lead 2. Heel Free 3. Recall from sit or down position 4. Sit one minute, handler in sight 5. Down two minutes, handler in sight.

**C-2 BEGINNERS:** 1. Heel on Lead 2. Heel Free 3. Recall from sit or down position 4. Retrieve any article 5. Sit one minute handler in sight 6. Down two minutes, handler in sight.

**C-3 NOVICE:** 1. Temperament Test 2. Heel on Lead 3. Heel Free 4. Recall from sit or down 5. Retrieve a dumb bell 6. Sit one minute, handler in sight 7. Down two minutes handler in sight.

**C-4 TEST A:** 1. Heel on lead 2. Temperament test 3. Heel free 4. Recall from sit or down position 5. Retrieve a Dumb bell 6. Sit one minute. Handler in sight 7. Down five minutes. Handler out of sight 8. Scent Discrimination.

**C-5 TEST B Graduate:** 1. Heel Free 2. send away, Drop and Recall 3. Retrieve any one article provided by the Judge 4. Stand one minute 5. Sit two minutes, handler out of sight 6. Down ten minutes, handler out of sight 7. Scent Discrimination.

**C-6 TEST C Open:** 1. Heel work 2. Send away, Drop and Recall 3. Retrieve any one article 4. Distant control 5. Sit two minutes, handler out of sight 6. Down ten minutes, handler out of sight 7. Scent Discrimination.

**C-7 COMPANION DOG:** 1. Heel on Lead 2. Stand for examination 3. Heel Free 4. Recall 5. Long sit 6. Long down.

### **NOTE:**

1. Dog participating in Test "C" shall not be entered in any other class except Companion Dog Class.
2. A dog can be entered only in 2 Classes apart from Companion Dog Class.
3. Bitches in season are not allowed to compete for Obedience.
4. A dog may be entered in Obedience classes without being entered in the Breed Classes.
5. Challenge Certificates will be awarded to all dogs irrespective of sex who have obtained 290 marks and above at test "C" open.

#### EXTRACTS FROM K.C.I. REGULATION FOR SHOWS:

Not be used as a name or part of the name in connection with any Classes other than as defined therein.

**a) CHAMPION CLASS** is one in which all dogs that have attained their championship title on the day of sending the entries may compete.

**b) OPEN CLASS** is one in which all dogs of that breed or variety of breed may compete.

**c) B.I. CLASS** is a class in which only dogs, bred and begotten in India, shall be eligible, Dogs begotten abroad and born in India or on the voyage out, are imported, dogs under Regulations for Registrations.

**d) INTERMEDIATE CLASS** is one in which dogs that are 19 months of age and not exceeding 36 months on the first day of the show can compete.

**e) JUNIOR CLASS** is one in which dogs that are 13 months of age and not exceeding 18 months on the first day of the show may be entered.

**f) PUPPY CLASS** is one in which dogs that are 7 months of age and not exceeding 12 months on the first day of the show be entered.

**g) MINOR PUPPY CLASS** is one in which dogs that are 4 months of age and not exceeding 6 months on the first day of the show be entered.

**3.** A dog imported from abroad shall be eligible to be entered in any class that they are eligible for.

**4.** A dog may be entered in Obedience Class only without being entered in any of its Breed Classes.

**5. Special Prizes:** No dog shall be eligible to compete for the special prize until it has been judged in its Breed Class or Classes or if it has been beaten in its Breed Class or Classes by another or either sex, eligible and compete for the special prize.

## **JUNIOR HANDLING COMPETITION: 1st February 2026 (Sunday) at 6.00 p.m**

There would also be a Junior Handling Competition in the show. Those wishing to participate must be in the age group of 12 to 16 proof of which should be sent along with the entry form for Junior handling. The Junior handler should be in a position to handle his/her own dog and also a different dog that would be given to them at the show grounds.



### Mr. Petru Muntean, Romania

---



I am a show judge since 1991 but I have joined the Dog World since 1974 when I got my first dog, a Pekingese. Over the years I have owned various breeds but my constant love remained the Dachshunds. In 1986 I became the President of Hunedoara County Kennel Club, and also a member in the Romanian Kennel Club's board. From these positions, I have organized various shows and many other canine competitions. During 1996-2001, I had the honor of being elected President of the Romanian Kennel Club. I have been nominated as all-rounder judge in 2005 and, the same year elected as vice-president of Romanian Kennel Club, position I assume until today.

As international judge, I had the opportunity to judge in more than 50 countries all over the World. All this years I had the pleasure and the honor to judge some important events as European, Asian section shows and World Dog Shows and I consider myself the proud inventor of the most well-known Romanian Dog Show ... Dracula Golden Trophy.

One of my ambitions, was to be able to judge in all F.C.I. official languages to which I can add the Italian, Hungarian and Russian. Member of the board of the FCI standards commission.

### Mr. John Bryson, Australia

---



My involvement with purebred dogs began in the late 1970's, when I met my wife of over 40 years, 2 Great Danes were part of the deal. We bred and exhibited Great Danes successfully, owning and breeding Best in Show winners until the mid 90's, when English Foxhounds started to take over the kennel.

Since then we have bred and owned Best in Show, Royal Group winning & Record breaking English Foxhounds & Harriers. We have bred or owned over 47 champions in these breeds. In recent years hounds from our kennel Foxhunt have been exported to the USA, Europe and New Zealand.

My three daughters also breed and exhibit dogs and through them I have had a direct involvement in Beagles, Boxers, Shar Pei, Siberian Huskies, Afghan Hounds, Rhodesian Ridgebacks and more recently Dobermanns. All of those breeds have enjoyed considerable success.

I have been involved with club Management for many of the years I have been involved in conformation showing and I am President of Medowie ABKC, Vice President of Liverpool ABKC, Secretary of Bay City ABKC, as well as Show Secretary for many other clubs. I also serve on the board at Dogs NSW.

I am privileged to be a Councillor at the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW where my main role currently is Chairman of Domestic Animals, a role which enables me the great honour of overseeing the organisation and successful execution of one of Australia's largest and most prestigious shows The Sydney Royal Dog Show.

My Judging career commenced in 1989 and since then I have been lucky enough to have judged in all states of Australia, overseas in Finland, The Philippines, Indonesia, Canada, The USA, Japan and extensively in New Zealand.

For the last 20 years, I have been involved in publishing. Our company Top Dog Media produces canine publications including Dog News Australia of which I am Editor-in-chief. Over two decades it has enabled me to see dogs in depth from Australia, Asia and in fact the world.

As part of my work with Top Dog Media I wrote the best selling book The Concise Australian Dog Judges Guide, which has now had four editions and been eagerly sought after by judges all over the world. I look forward to expanding my horizons and judging some wonderful dogs at your show.

### **Mr. Gerard Jipping, Netherlands**

---



Dogs have always been part of Gerard's life and as from 1976 especially Afghan Hounds. Around 1984 he successfully showed his Afghan Hounds. He was co-owner breeder Afghan Hounds with the prefix "El Harakat" from 1993 till 2015. Afghan Hounds from "El Harakat" where all over the world like France, USA, Germany, Switzerland, Israel, Denmark etc. His dogs had many (International & national) championships and Titles.

Becoming more and more interested in dogs, Gerard started to his cynological study in 1990 and in 1995 he did his first breed exam for the Afghan Hound. Ten years later he is group judge of his favorite FCI group 10. At this moment he is also group judge of FCI group 1, 5 and 9, some breeds of FCI group 2, 3, 7 and 8. Gerard judged in about 65 countries, almost all European countries, and in Africa, Asia, Australia and North & South America at national and international Dog shows (including about 12 FCI section shows and 12 FCI World Dog Shows) Champion of Champion shows, many breed specialties and title shows.

Gerard is already long time active in different cynological activities, like in the past 14 years president of the Dutch Kennel Club (2004-2017), 18 years president of the Dutch Afghan Hound Club (NVOW), 5 years president form the Dutch Sight Hound FCI group 10, 6 years member of the dispute committee of the Dutch Kennel Club, Many lectures given about breeds and cynological matters (National & International).

On till now he is still active: since 2005 as president from The FCI Euro Sighthound Show, since 2011 as vice-president of the FCI, since 2020 as chairman of the regional club "Noorder Kynologen Club" and since 2020 as president FCI International Martini Dog Show (MDS).

In the past he organized International dog shows and breed specialties in German and Netherlands. Mostly Sight hound specialties and International FCI shows, but he was also the president form the FCI Euro Dog Show 2011 and the biggest dog event in the world, with 35000 dogs in connection with FCI World Dog Show 2018 in Amsterdam.

### **Mr.Stefan Mitrevksi, Macedonia**

---



Stefan Mitrevski became involved in showing and breeding dogs from 2005 starting a successful exhibitor career, helping with the organization of Macedonian dog shows , and in 2007 registered his Siberian Husky Kennel "Inner Vision". That way he began the "Inner Vision" breeding program and since that time has won many national and international shows where he had great success due to the outstanding producing ability of his foundation sires and

dams . He participated as an exhibitor at the European and World Dog Shows as well with great results . In 2015 dogs from our breeding :“Silverado Of Inner Vision”- Junior World Winner and “Tristan Of Inner Vision” - Vice Junior European Winner “Tristan Of Inner Vision”. In 2016 we got one more Vice Junior European Winner - Inner Vision Viva El Paso. In 2021 Ch.Inner Vision Fabian became Vice World Winner as well.

Born in Skopje , the capital city of Macedonia , Stefan loved animals from early age, especially dogs and cats that grew up by his side . This special kind of love and affection towards dogs started with the hunting dogs and Irish Setter that he owned as a youngster. Together with his family later in 1994 he owned few German Shepherds , but later on as his taste developed he became devoted to the Siberian Husky Breed . He has also exported many show dogs across USA, Europe and Asia and established kennels .



## Mr. Andi Hudono, Indonesia

---



From a young age, I have always have dogs and from 1972, I started breeding and showing Chihuahua, Pekingese, Miniature Pinscher. To date, I have breed and owned over 80 Indonesian, Indian, Japanese, Singaporean and American Champions in a number of breeds.

I graduated in 1978, from the University of Indonesia Medical School and obtained my degree and training in Obstetrics and Gynaecology in England. I am a member of The Royal College of Obstetrician and Gynaecologist, England and a practicing consultant in Jakarta (Indonesia), specializing in infertility. During my stay in England, I visited and gained first-hand experience and knowledge from famous breeders there, such as Ocobo (English Bulldog), Yeosinga, Apoco Deodar (Chihuahua), Ashgate (West Highland White Terrier), Fantasia/Upend (Rottweiler) and several others.

My first import from England was a Chihuahua. My first Miniature Pinscher import was a red male in 1983 from Japan and this dog became an Indonesian Champion and the top Miniature Pinscher in Indonesia. I have also bred Miniature Pinscher. My interest also extends to Pomeranians, imported from England. From England, I imported Mini Smooth Dachshunds and Boxers. I have bred and shown Mini Smooth Dachshund successfully. The Boxers came from the famous Marbelton Kennel.

The first Dobermann I owned was in 1978. My first import in 1980 was a brown male from the USA. This dog became the no.1 Indonesian Dobermann, and then went on to become an Indonesian, American, and Canadian Champion. Later I imported Dobermann from the famous Franckenhorst breeder and dogs with Nordenstamm Bloodlines from Europe. Harmonic Dobermanns are the result of these Americans, Franckenhorst and Nordenstamm bloodline combinations. I have exported Dobermanns to Singapore, India, Philipine, Canada, England and Europe.

I am a founding member and the breed counsellor of The Dobermann Club of Indonesia. I had served for several years as a Vice Chairman, breed counsellor, committee and was Chairman of The Judges Training Committee of The Indonesia Kennel Club (PERKIN).

My first license to judge Dobermann from The Indonesian Kennel Club was in 1993. In 2006 I have been approved to judge Dobermann by The Dobermann Club in England, and in 2009 The Kennel Club in UK approved me to give CC merit in UK. At present I am licensed to judge and award Challenge Certificate (CAC and CACIB) on All Breeds including FCI Shows, and have judged Specialty, Multi Breeds, and All Breeds Shows.

I have judged Dobermann, Boxer, Welsh Corgi Pembroke, at the prestigious World Dog Show 2018 in Amsterdam, Euro Dog Show in Kortrijk Belgium, England/U.K, Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, France, Spain, Portugal, Ireland, Luxembourg, Italy, Lithuania, Estonia, Russia, Latvia, Croatia, Hungary, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Canada, Brazil, Peru, Puerto Rico, Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore, Philippine, Japan, Korea, Taiwan, India, China and various cities in Indonesia, including Best In Show, in CACIB Show, I will be judging in India in Jan 2026 and Lithuania in Jul 2026.

### **Mrs. Tatjana Urek, Netherlands**

Tatjana got her first dog, an English Cocker Spaniel, at the age of 14. During her study at the Law University she was active in the work of the local kennel club in Trbovlje, Slovenia. For the regional Club in Trbovlje she organized the first national CAC show in 1993, and was the Show manager till 2015. She was also the Show manager for other Slovenian International shows.

She bought her first Shih Tzu in 1989. This female was the foundation of her Potala Dalaj Lama kennel. She was a successful breeder of Shih Tzu, several champions coming from her kennel.
